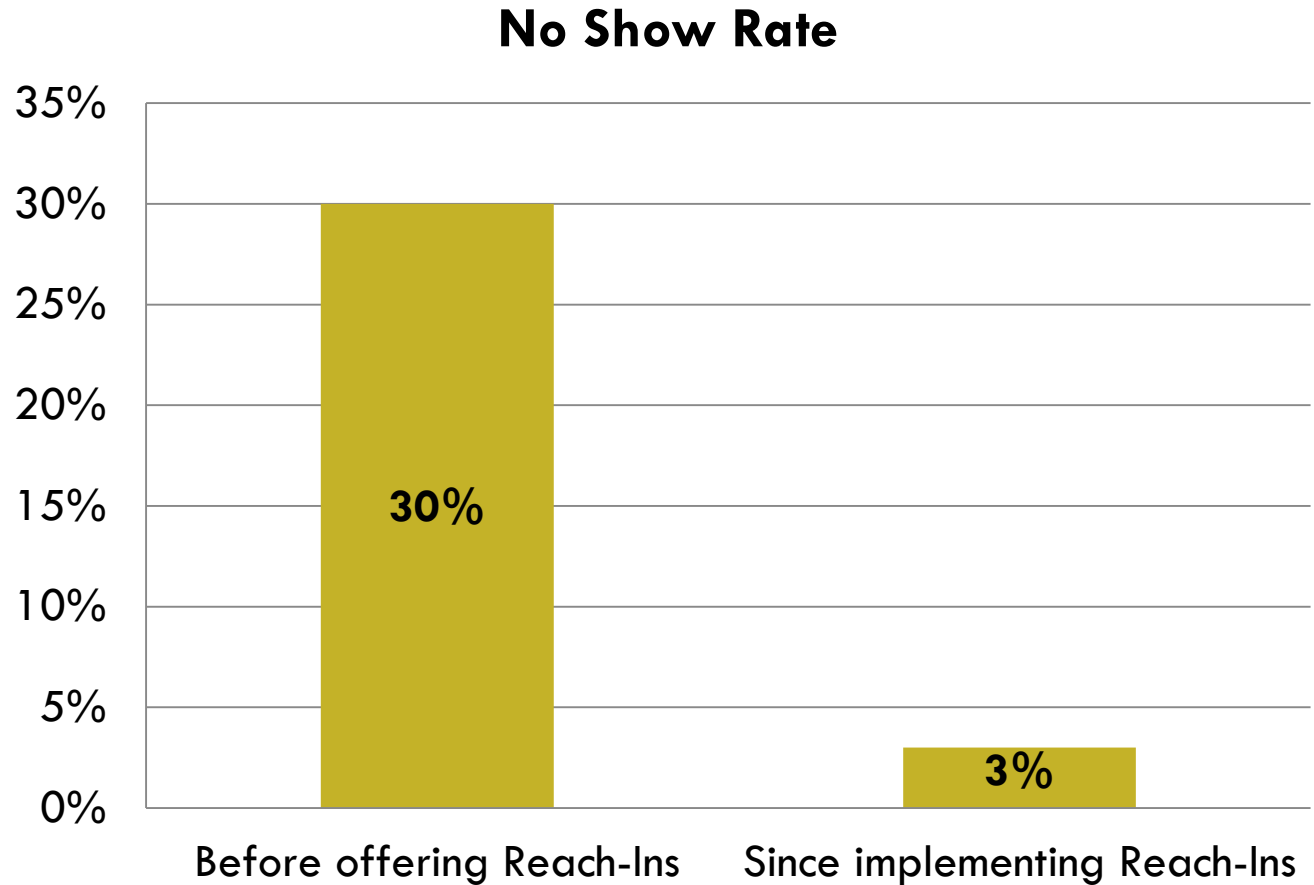

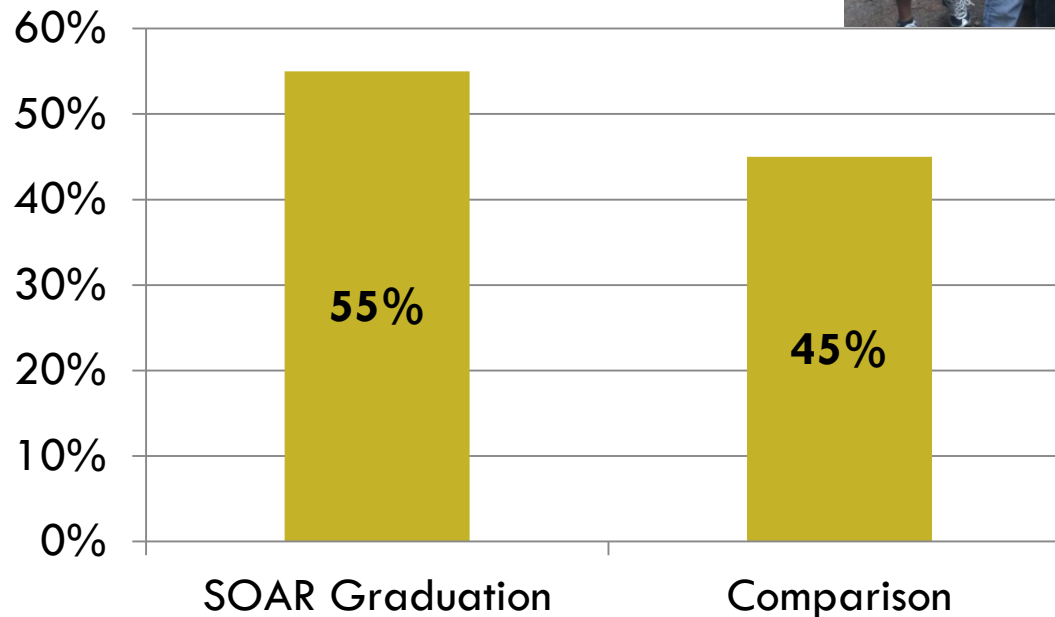

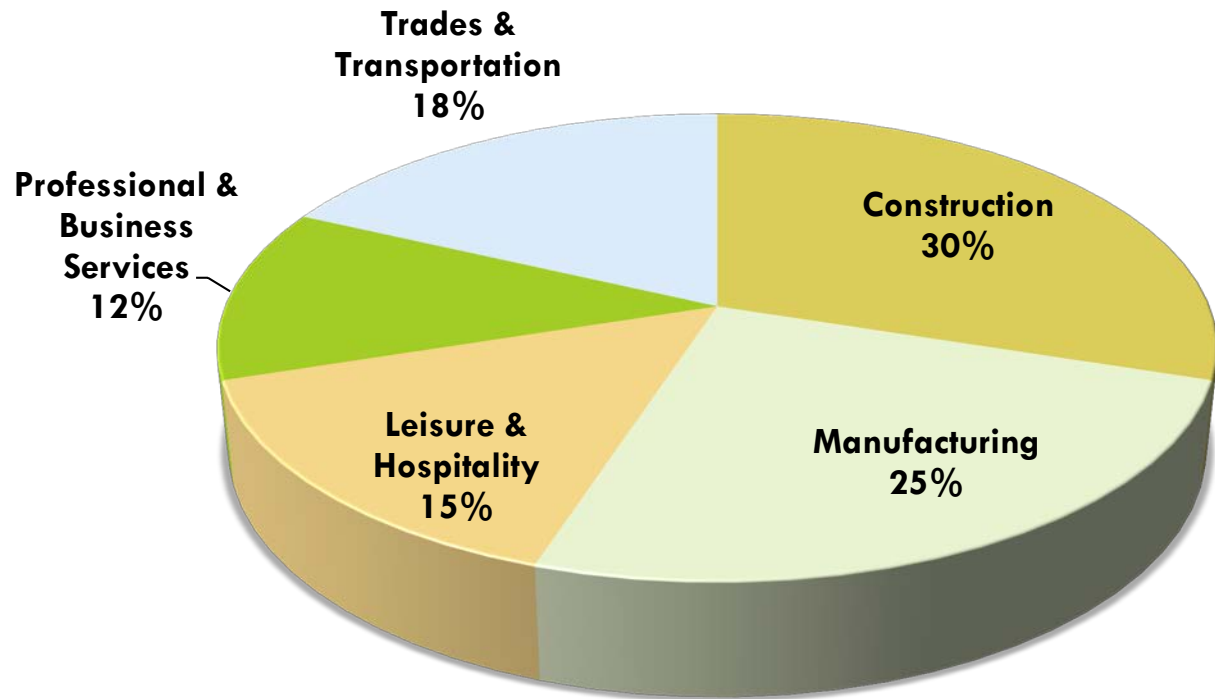

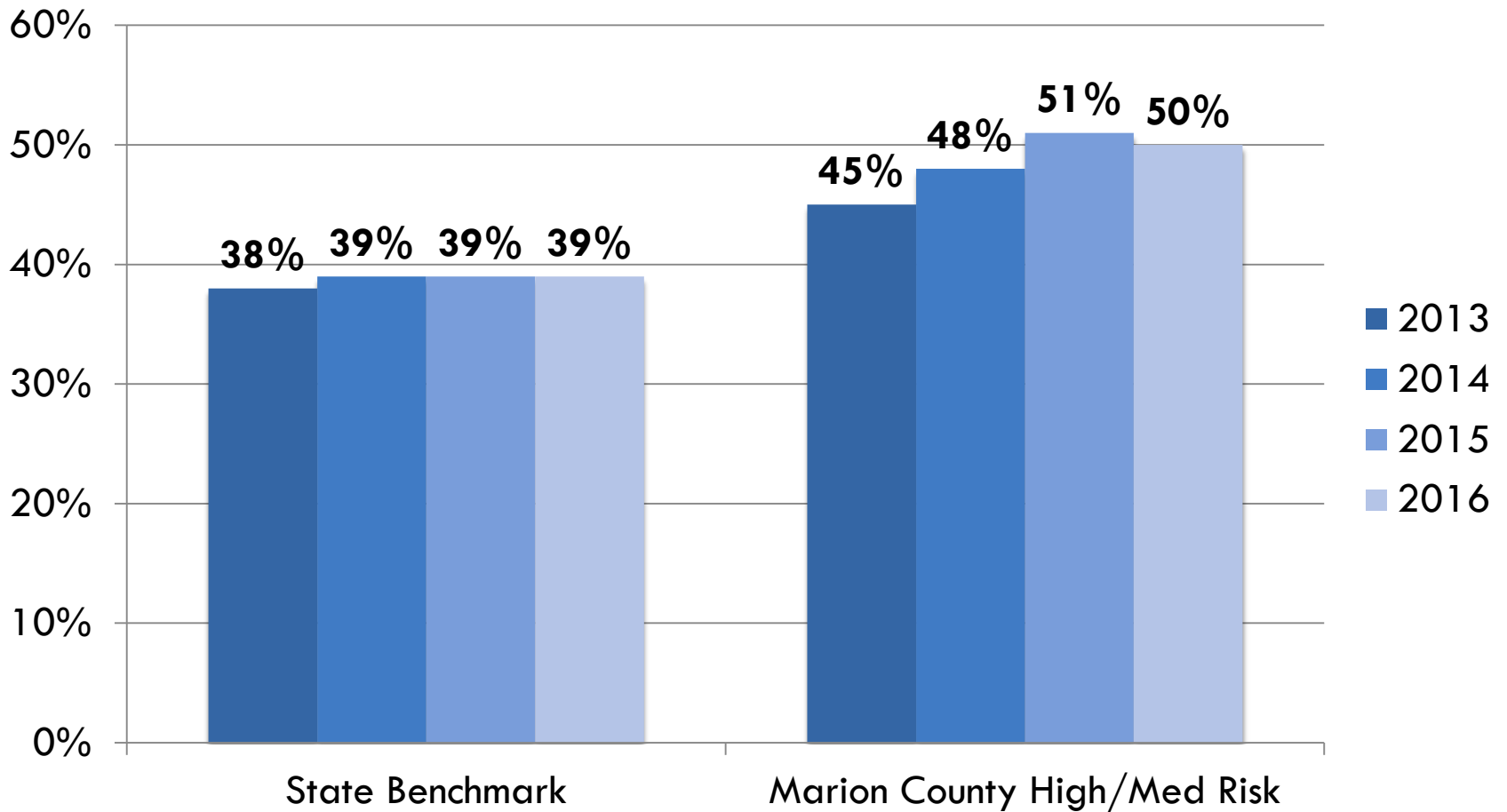

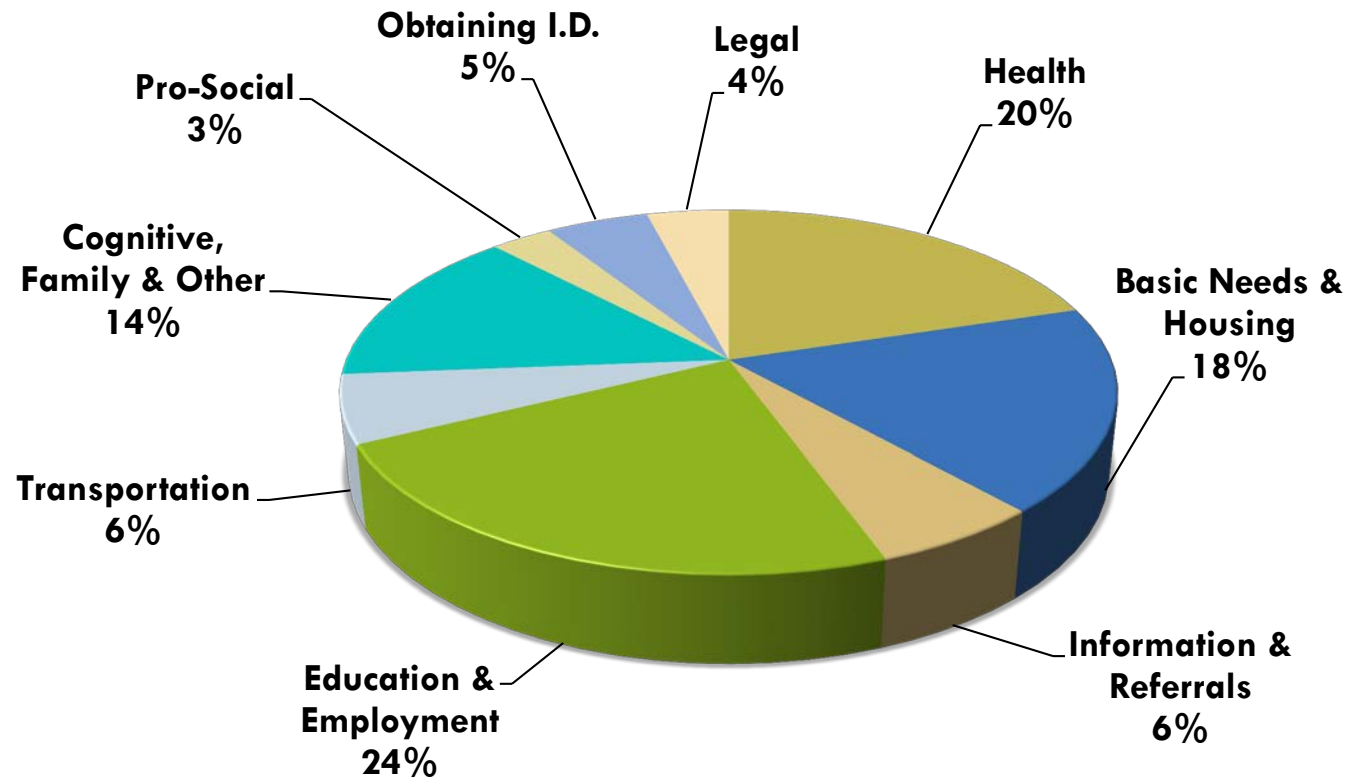

# ROOSEVELT CROSSING



Roosevelt Crossing is a 75 bed transitional facility for Sponsors, Inc. Sponsors' mission is to assist men and women from Lane County released from Oregon State correctional facilities and the Lane County jail in making a successful re-entry into the community. Success results in a safer community, the reunification of families and children, the establishment of the released offender as a positive role model for his/her children, and citizens who pay taxes and are contributing, productive members of the community. Sponsors is based on the belief that people can and do change, and that a strategic intervention at the appropriate moment can serve as a catalyst in that change.

Our design goals were to create a supportive home-like atmosphere, promote energy and resource efficiency and bring Sponsors' services to the residents. The facility's buildings surround a lively courtyard and include Sponsors' administrative and case management offices and conference rooms, a re-entry resource center, residential suites and recreational areas.

The primary sustainable feature for Roosevelt Crossing is a unique solar thermal system, using solar energy for hot water in a continuous loop through the project. Since the solar system is publicly funded (ODOJ and EWEB), one of the potential benefits is to inform citizens about how it's helping reduce energy costs and green house gases through the solar data monitoring website at the University of Oregon.

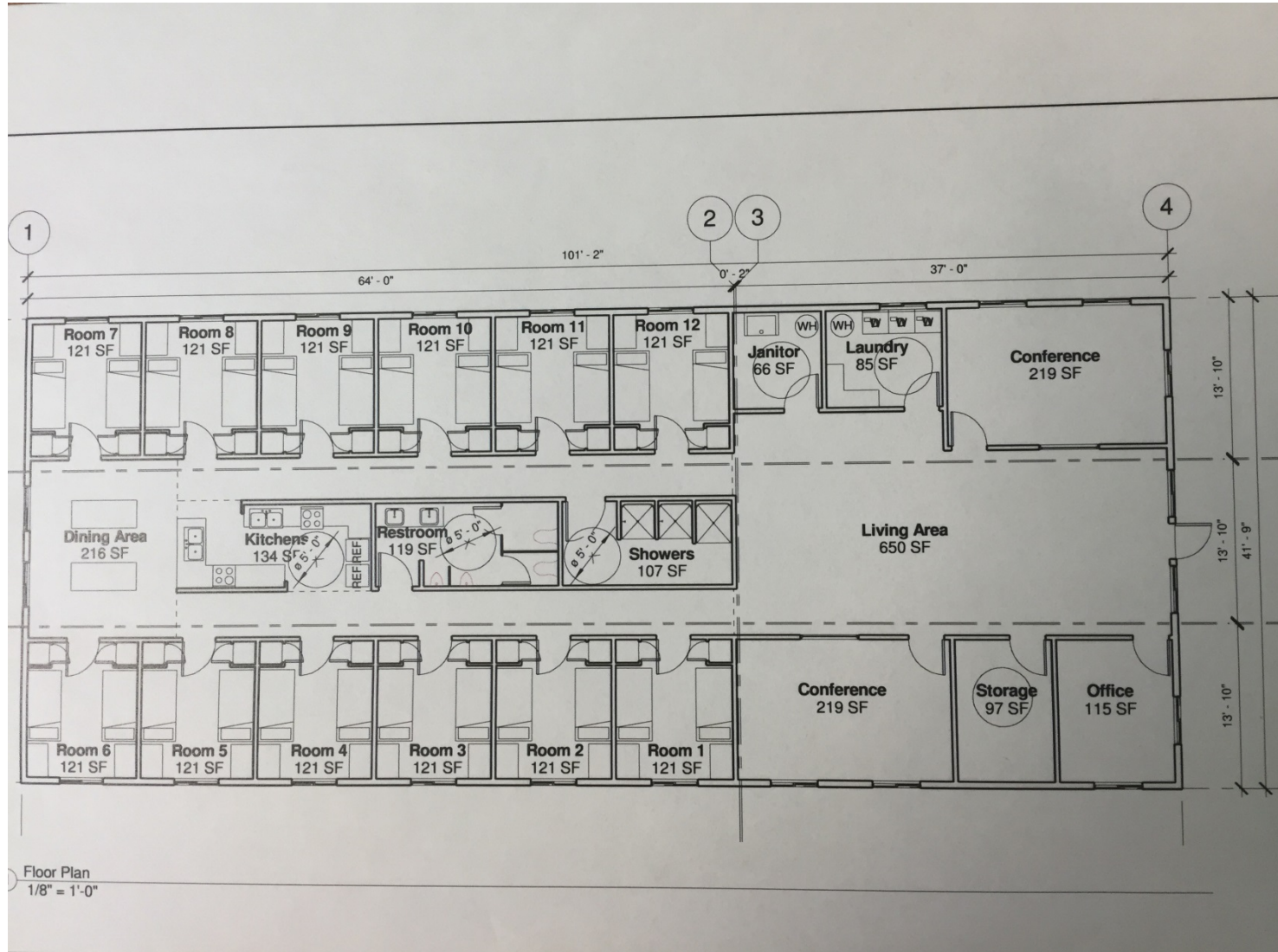

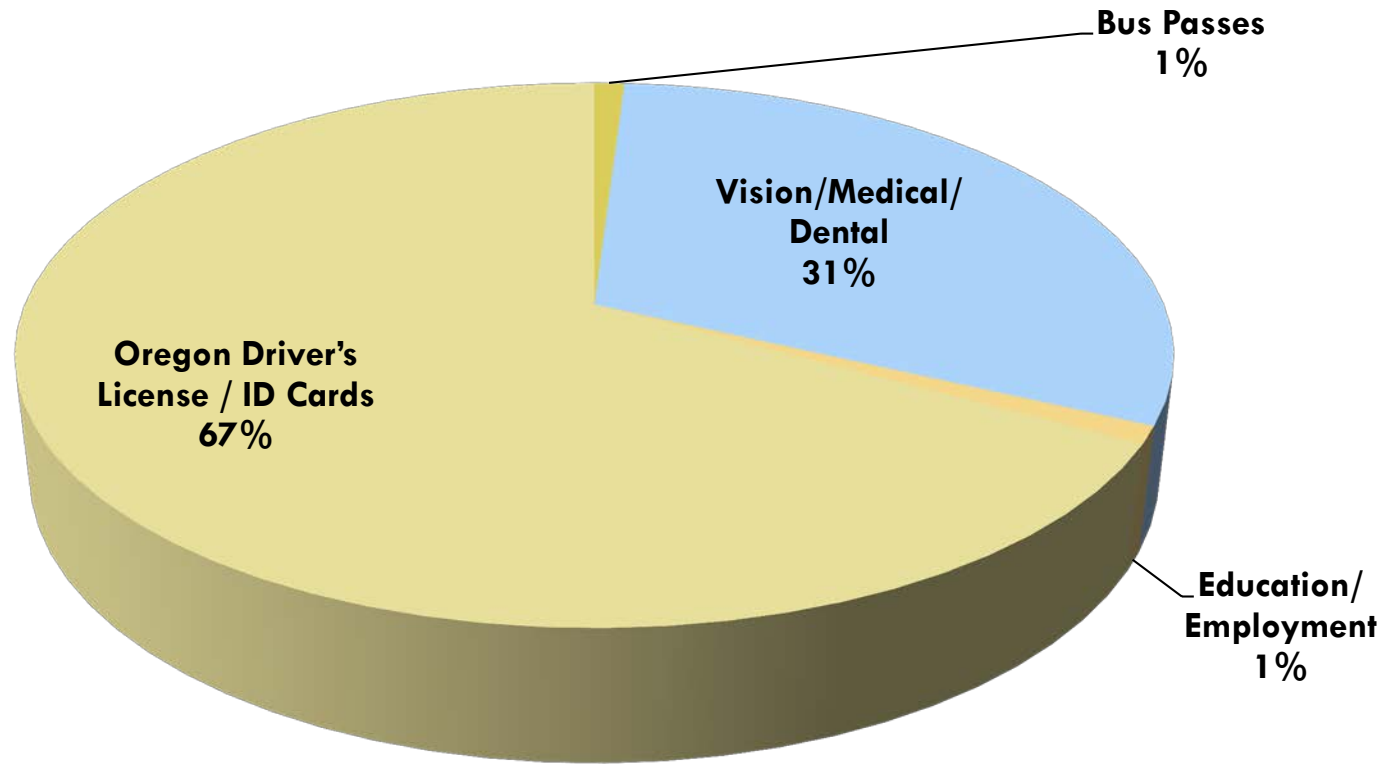
**Cost per Day**
