

Independent Medical Professional Medical Doctor / Nurse Practitioner / Physician Assistant

Marion County Health and Human Services' Addictions Treatment Services is seeking a medical doctor, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant to contract for the County Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) Program.

The Marion County Drug Alcohol and Drug Treatment Program provides a broad range of services to individuals and community members who present with symptoms consistent with chemical dependency and/or co-existing mental health or behavioral issues. Specific job duties are to:

- 1. Provide skilled medical services to Health and Human Service's Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) Program.
- 2. Review and approve the assessment, services, and supports identified in the Individual Service and Support Plan (ISSP) for each individual receiving addiction treatment services.
- 3. Assess the physical, emotional, and developmental status of individuals and their families.
- 4. Provide positive intervention to maintain, restore, or improve the health of individuals and their families.
- 5. Evaluate the results of treatment intervention based on feedback elicited from the individual and family members, treatment team members, behavioral observations, or other providers.
- 6. Contribute to revisions of individuals' ISSP on the basis of individuals' responses to treatment and new information.
- 7. Prescribe and dispense medication according to all rules governed by Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) licensure, as supported by professional guidelines and publications, and meets the standards of care in the community.
- 8. Provide consultation and education to staff and other service providers in the areas of medication management and mental health intervention.
- 9. Provide general health education to individuals, staff, and the community, including education on HIV infection and prevention.
- 10. Work with other health care team members in the promotion and provision of comprehensive health care.
- 11. Collaborate with team members and supervisors in the improvement of current services and development of new services.
- 12. Collaborate with nurses and staff in the development, and continual re-evaluation, of standing orders, including appropriate medications.
- 13. Provide documentation that meets Medicare, Medicaid, and other contracted insurance requirements, in electronic and/or paper format, according to County policies and procedures.

Marion County Health and Human Services Drug and Alcohol Treatment Services are located in the beautiful Willamette Valley, forty minutes south of Portland and an hour from mountains and ocean beaches. The position requires Oregon License and DEA registration. Contractor will perform services as an independent contractor, not as an employee of Marion County.
