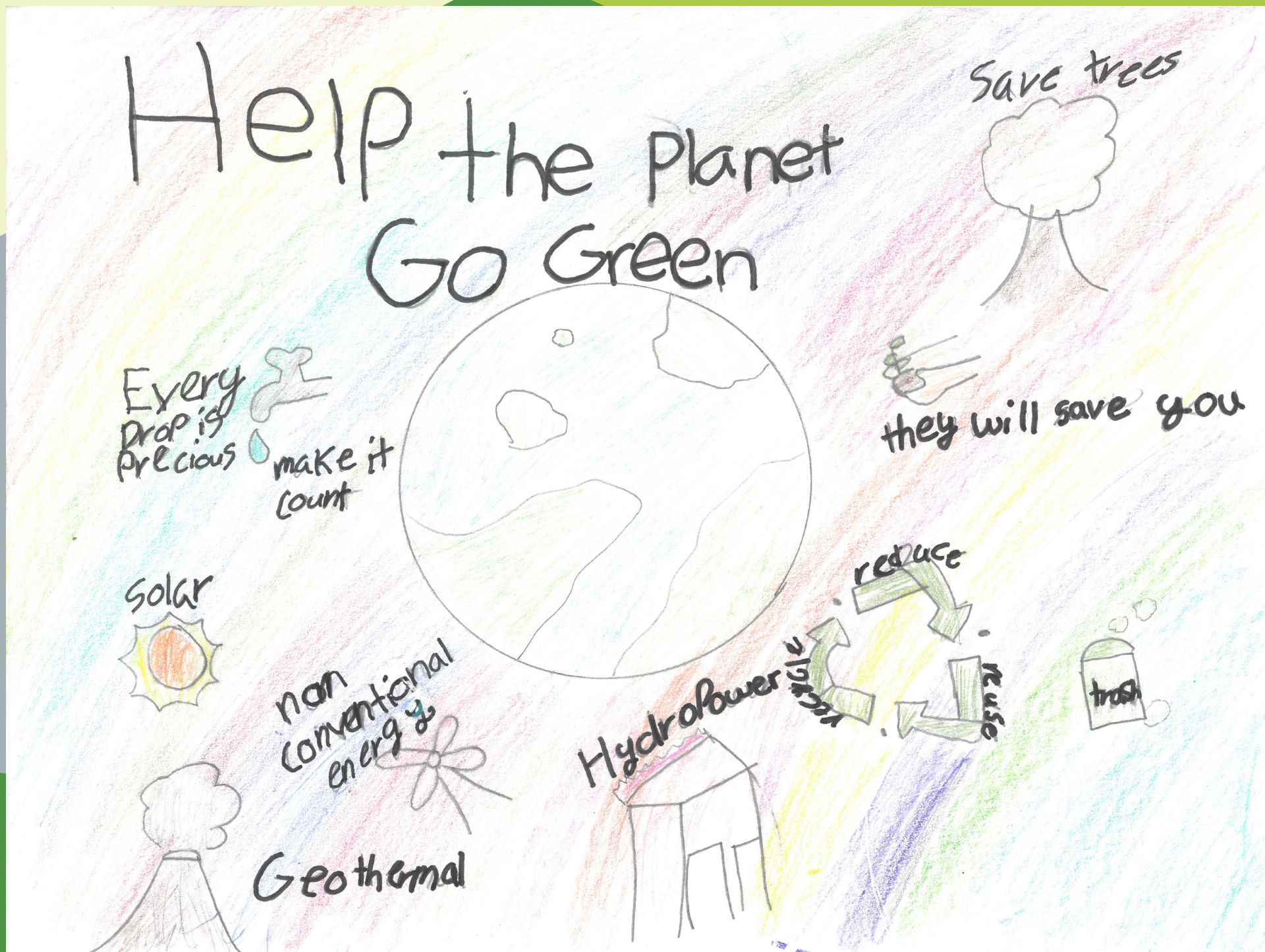

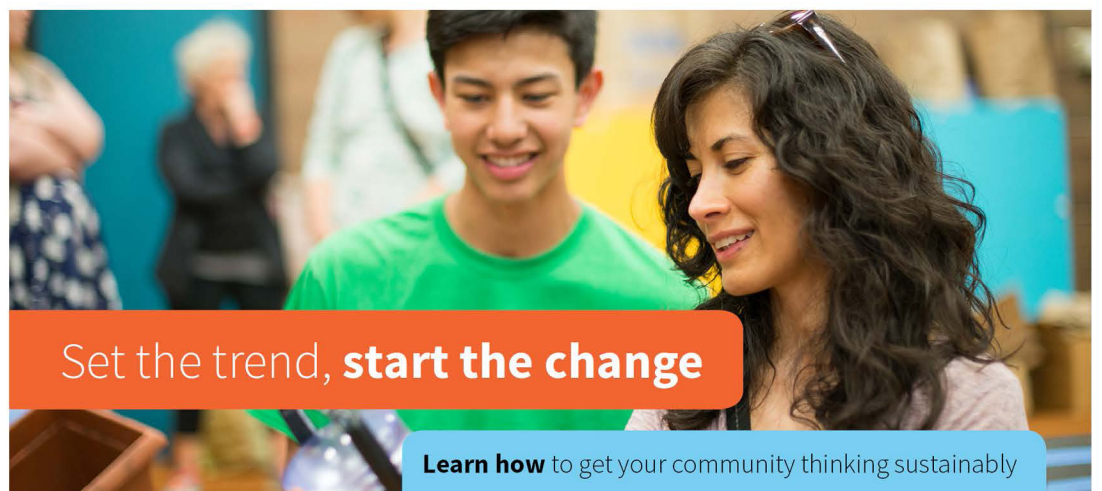

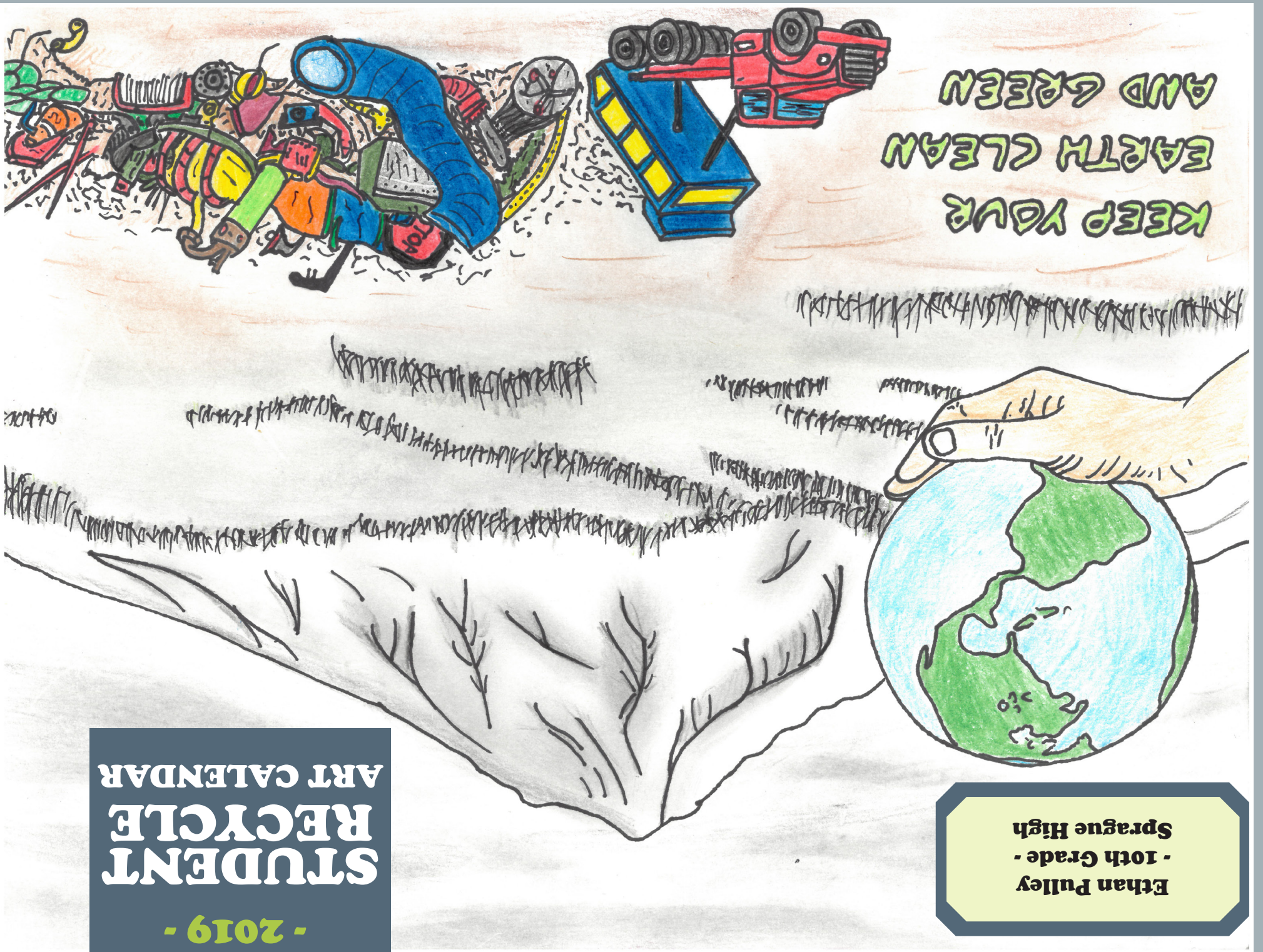
## IN THE SUMMER OF 2018...

## Small Recycling Bin

These Items Go In The  
SMALL RECYCLING BIN:

- Household Batteries  
Alkaline, rechargeable, and small button cells. Sizes AAAA through D, 6 Volt - 9 Volt. Must be sealed in a zip-sealed bag.
- Usable Latex Paint and Oil Based Paint  
Place up to 2, one-gallon labeled cans. Please; NO rusty cans!
- Used Motor Oil  
In a sealed, leak-proof, plastic screw-top container no larger than one gallon.
- Antifreeze  
Place into screw-top see-thru plastic jug. Keep separate from motor oil.
- Glass Bottles & Jars  
Please keep bottle and jars empty, clean, and dry! (No broken glass)  
*No other types of glass please.*
- Vegetable Cooking Oil  
Place up to 2 gallons of cooled oil into original or clean see-thru plastic screw-top container.



**IMPORTANT**
