

THE OREGON GREEN SCHOOL PROGRAM

OGS Mission: The mission of the OGSA is to assist Oregon schools in setting up and maintaining effective, permanent waste reduction and resource efficiency programs that improve the school environment and community and to recognize schools for their efforts and achievements.

Three Levels of Recognition:

1. Green School: Awarded a certificate and window decal

Merit: Awarded a plaque
Premier: Awarded a flag

How to Apply: Five major sections of application

1. Involvement: School appoints an on-site recycling coordinator

Green – Involve staff and students in waste reduction efforts

Merit – Provide waste reduction education and assistance to another school

Premier – Provide waste reduction education and assistance to the community

2. Evaluation: School conducts a waste assessment and describes what they are throwing away

Green - Calculate volume of waste, calculate energy and water use

Merit – Identify and document key waste materials

Premier – Graph and describe annual solid waste and recycling trends at school

3. Goals (and permanence): School determines waste reduction goals

Green – List goals and describe a plan to maintain the program over time Merit – Identify school-wide policy for reducing waste.

Premier – Complete goals for first year and describe obstacles

4. Reduction: Describe schools recycling and energy conservation practices

Green – List at least 3 materials being recycled

Merit - Recycle at least 6 materials and purchase at least 1 item with post-consumer recycled content

Premier – Demonstrate reduction in purchase or consumption of a product

5. Reporting: Inform school community

Green – Inform principal, custodian, food service, teaching staff, and students

Merit – Parent/teacher organization, student government

Premier – School board

Your Green School Coordinator will support you and your school by assisting with waste audits, advising about grants and workshops, providing lesson plans and information about field trips.

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
