#### Make Recycled Paper

Age: 2nd - 8th grades Time: 40 - 75 minutes

This is one of our most popular kits! Students make cards.

which after a few days of drying can be taken home or given as gifts. This activity requires 15 - 20 minutes to set up and clean up.



# Make Recycled Crayons

Age: Pre-K - 3rd grades

Time: 30 - 45 minutes

Students take broken crayons and turn them into circular crayons with a swirl of different colors. Like snowflakes, no two are identical.



### Make a Classroom Worm Bin

Age: 2nd - 12th grades

Time: 20 - 45 minutes

The class builds a worm bin and then monitors and feeds their new classroom pets throughout the year. Worms and materials provided while supplies last.



# Make Newspaper Seedling Pots

Age: 2nd grade - adult

Time: 20 - 30 minutes

Using recycled newspapers, students make little paper pots which they fill with compost. They can plant wildflowers in these paper pots and transplant when they go home.



#### Waste Audits

Age: 3rd - 12th grades
Time: 45 - 75 minutes
Students measure the weight
and volume of the school's
trash. This is a requirement for

becoming an Oregon Green School.



# Waste Audit Murals

Age: 3rd - 12th grades

Time: 40 - 60 minutes

Students create garbage murals that are hung up in the school to share the results of the waste audits with students, staff and parents.



# Make Upcycled Bookmarks & Magnets

Age: K - 4th grades
Time: 20 - 45 minutes
Students decorate cut out
pieces of cereal boxes or tin

can tops/bottoms and turn

them into bookmarks and magnets.



# Recycling Sorting Game

Age: K - 12th grades

Time: 20 minutes

Students sort the recycling into the proper bins and the teacher makes any corrections. Combine with the "Learn How Recycling Works" video to turn this into a 40+ minute activity.



#### Make a Composter

Age: 2nd - 12th grades **Time:** 20 - 60+ minutes

If your school is interested in starting an on-site composting program, we can provide a composter and give you and your students tips on how to set up the program and maintain your compost pile. \*Some schools are also eligible for assistance with a full-scale cafeteria & food waste program through their hauler.



#### Recycling Quiz Show

Age: 5th - 12th grades

Time: 20 - 60 minutes (totally

flexible)

In this activity students work in teams to score points by answering questions about waste reduction, reuse, recycling and composting. It requires that the room have equipment to project a PowerPoint.



#### Make a Reusable Bag

Age: K - 6+ grades Time: 20 - 45 minutes This activity involves creating

reusable shopping bags. You have

the option of making them from t-shirts (requires some sewing and enough old shirts) or decorating canvas bags (while supplies last). Students decorate with fabric markers.



### Make an Upcycled Journal

Age: 4th - 8th grades Time: 45 - 90 minutes

This hands-on activity allows students to create their own journals using materials that would have been recycled or thrown away. If we don't have enough supplies on hand, it will require you to collect some recyclables.

Age: Pre-K - 12th grades

Time: 20 - 120 minutes (wide range) We have lots of lesson plans covering a wide range of environmental topics, including solid waste issues, climate change, water quality, energy issues and more. Please contact us for more information.



## Learn How Recycling Works

Age: 4 - 12th grades

Time: 15 - 40 minutes

This informational video (English/Spanish) follows the journey of 5 common recyclables as they are transformed into new products. Combine with the "Recycling Sorting Game" or challenge kids to answer questions about it.

Age: Pre-K - 12th grades Time: 1 hour - all day
