To Marion County Hearings Officer,

The newly submitted proposed traffic plan will be even more harmful to those along Liberty Road, including residents and farms.

I live between Ankeny Hill Road and Liberty Road. I travel Liberty Road daily to get to town, as do most of my neighbors in Spring Lake Estates. Some also work on weekends. As I said in previously submitted testimony, the traffic tie ups will significantly affect our lives for the four days of the festival. The new traffic plan only creates new risks.

I have seen the revised TIA, submitted by the applicant on April 6, 2018. This plan has the northbound traffic of Interstate 5 exiting at Ankeny Hill and taking traffic in a long, out of the way loop east and then south through Jefferson and ultimately to Wintel Road and eventually to the event. This route is expected to move huge numbers of campers and cars, and there will be a need for long cueing of cars to avoid backups on Interstate 5.

However, the southbound traffic, which will likely be an even greater number of cars, is supposed to be exiting directly from the Ankeny Exit to Wintel Road to the event; a far, far shorter distance with much less cueing capacity.

This would mean cars would have to utilize alternative routes when traffic begins backing up on Interstate 5. They would likely use the Enchanted Way exit, and direct people to Hylo Road to Liberty Road going south, and then back to Liberty's merge into Buena Vista and then Wintel.

This would be a problem in a number of ways:

- 1. The plan creates too much traffic through the west and south end of the Ankeny Refuge.
- 2. The plan routes too much traffic along the dangerous, extreme hills of Hylo Road, and the dangerous curving narrow hilly Liberty Road. This route has two wineries, Coria Winery and Trinity Vineyards, with many homes and some farms.
- 3. The farms and wineries likely have not known they could be affected, and have not had a chance to submit testimony about the Festival's effect on their businesses. The wineries have tasting rooms and conduct numerous summer events.

- 4. Those of us who live in the area will find both Liberty Road and the Ankeny Hill entrance and exit to the freeway blocked with traffic. We will be trapped at home for the length of the event and we will be exposed to the possible danger of fire, drunk drivers on winding dangerous roads, additional noise and lights, etc.
- 5. There are two churches along Hylo Road and the entrance to the Friends Church is at a dangerous spot at the top of a sudden hill.
- 6. Even if the Festival staff did not re-route traffic, the GPS's of festival attendees driving south on the freeway will alert them to slow downs beyond the Enchanted Way exit and may direct them onto Enchanted Way to Hylo Road and then to the Liberty Route.

None of the traffic routes are good because the proposed Festival location is a bad one. The Ankeny Hill area of the freeway is prone to accidents; the area is hilly and has narrow winding, largely wooded and brushy shoulders. Hylo Road is especially dangerous due to very steep hills and valleys with low vision areas for driveways and even contains two churches along the way.

Therefore, the proposed revised TIA submitted by the applicant just creates new problems. The application should be denied for this proposed location.

I have lived within a few miles of the Refuge for almost 20 years. It is a quiet wildlife-filled sanctuary surrounded by farmland that rarely sees much traffic. There are so many varieties of creatures that rely on that peaceful place for their homes and nests.

To hold an enormous music festival on farmland grounds so close to this refuge as well as using the roads that travel through the refuge, is inviting terrible consequences. The noise level will be extreme, louder than any that has been experienced, for several days. Final Order Limited License Application LL-1739



Appeal Rights

This is a final order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date, the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Requested Water Use

On March 6, 2018, the Water Resources Department received completed application LL-1739 from Willamette Country Music Concerts LLC for the use of 50 gallons per minute from a well, located in the SE ¼, SE ¼, Section 21, Township 9 South, Range 3 West, W.M., for commercial uses at a country music festival, for the period August 5, 2019, through August 28, 2023, during the month of August only.

Authorities

The Department may approve a limited license pursuant to its authority under ORS 537.143, 537.144 and OAR 690-340-0030.

ORS 537.143(2) authorizes the Director to revoke the right to use water under a limited license if it causes injury to any water right or a minimum perennial streamflow.

A limited license will not be issued for more than five consecutive years for the same use, as directed by ORS 537.143(8).

Findings of Fact

- 1. The forms, fees, and map have been submitted, as required by OAR 690-340-0030(1).
- 2. The Department provided public notice of the application, on March 13, 2018, as required by OAR 690-340-0030(2).
- 3. This limited license request is limited to an area within a single drainage basin as required by OAR 690-340-0030(3).
- 4. The Department has determined that there is water available for the requested use.
- 5. The Department has determined that the proposed source has not been withdrawn from further appropriation per ORS 538.200.

- 6. The Department can allow issue a limited license for no longer than five years (ORS 537.143).
- 7. As part of its review to determine ground water availability, the Department's Ground Water/Hydrology Section has stipulated conditions pertaining to measurement and reporting, and decline in static water level.
- 8. The Department has not received other comments related to the possible issuance of the limited license.
- 9. Pursuant to OAR 690-340-0030(4)(5), conditions have been added with regard to notice and water-use measurement.
- 10. Marion County has indicated that the proposed use is compatible with the applicable acknowledged comprehensive land-use plan. A copy of the land use compatibility is in the file.

Conclusions of Law

The proposed water use will not impair or be detrimental to the public interest pursuant to OAR 690-340-0030(2), as limited in the order below.

Order

Therefore, pursuant to ORS 537.143, ORS 537.144, and OAR 690-340-0030, application LL-1739 is approved as conditioned below.

- 1. The period and rate of use for **LL-1739** shall be from August 5, 2019, through August 28, 2023, for the use of 50 gallons per minute from a well, for the purpose of commercial uses at a country music festival.
- 2. The licensee shall give notice to the Watermaster in the district where use is to occur not less than 15 days or more than 60 days in advance of using the water under the limited license. The notice shall include the location of the diversion, the quantity of water to be diverted and the intended use and place of use.
- 3. Before water use may begin under this limited license, the licensee shall install a totalizing flow meter at each point of appropriation. The totalizing flow meter must be installed and maintained in good working order. In addition the licensee shall maintain a record of all water use, including the total number of hours of pumping, the total quantity pumped, and the categories of beneficial use to which the water is applied. During the period of the limited license, the record of use shall be submitted to the Department annually, and shall be submitted to the Watermaster upon request.
- 4. The Director may revoke the right to use water for any reason described in ORS 537.143(2), and OAR 690-340-0030(6). Such revocation may be prompted by field regulatory activities or by any other information.

- 5. Use of water under a limited license shall not have priority over any water right exercised according to a permit or certificate, and shall be subordinate to all other authorized uses that rely upon the same source.
- 6. A copy of this limited license shall be kept at the place of use, and be available for inspection by the Watermaster or other state authority.

NOTE: This water-use authorization is temporary. Applicants are advised that issuance of this final order does not guarantee that any permit for the authorized use will be issued in the future; any investments should be made with that in mind.

Thank you for contacting Wetlands and Wildlife LLC regarding a proposed country music festival within Marion County, OR. The Marion County Planning Division has reviewed a Conditional Use Application (17-043/Gross) and provided findings based on facts provided in the application. I have commented on this application in a previous memo dated 10/27/2017, and you have asked me to address the written comments submitted which are concerned with impacts to fish and wildlife (particularly those which are federally listed under the Endangered Species Act). I have repeated the summary below to verify my understanding of the proposed music festival.

General Overview

The project area (Figure 1) is located at 13054 Jorgenson Road S and in the 3700 block of Wintel Road S, Jefferson (T9S; R3W; Section 19; tax lot 400; Section 21; tax lot 700; Section 28; tax lots 100, 300, 400, 500, 600 and 700; Section 28D; tax lot 800, 1000 and 1100). The proposed venue is located on farmed land which has been producing grass for several decades. Abutting land uses include Ankeny Wildlife Refuge to the north/northwest, a block of land measuring approximately 2,800 acres. Other land uses adjoin the venue but are outside the scope of this memorandum.

The proposed concert venue would accommodate 30,000 concert viewers/day and their vehicles; approximately 10,000 overnight campers will be accommodated based on the application estimates. Most of the proposed venue activities would occur directly abutting the Ankeny Wildlife Refuge, with parking and the main stage being proposed up to the property line of the refuge. Camping is proposed setback from the refuge to the south and west.

The main stage is proposed to be abutting a forested portion of the refuge, with the stage and lighting directed south and east (opposite the refuge). A timeline has been set for the venue, establishing enforced quiet hours between 24:00 and 07:00.

Federally Listed Species

The Sidney Power Ditch is listed as Essential Salmon Habitat (ESH) by the State of Oregon. This ditch is also technically contiguous with federally listed critical habitat for Chinook salmon and Steelhead. This ditch bisects one of the parcels proposed for festival use, and this ditch originates several miles southeast of the proposed festival parcels. Based on modeled flow volume in August (Streamstats, 2018), the ditch will have very little if any flow or pooling water during the festival.

Other rare species have been found in proximity to the festival grounds, although their habitat needs are not met within the proposed festival area. Regularly farmed land severely diminishes the available habitat for most relevant rare species due to management techniques used to produce high yield crops.

The primary concern to any aquatic listed species would be a significant single spill or cumulative small spills which could migrate into a waterway. Specific festival staff will be provided with, and trained to use, absorbent socks to mitigate this threat. Festival staff will allocate an appropriate quantity of absorbent socks capable of capturing different target pollutants.

Exclusion of people from the "Sidney Ditch" and the abutting Ankeny Wildlife Refuge will be enforced. Fisheries staff with ODFW and USFWS will be consulted 2 months or more before the event to allow them time to manage refuge water levels or other refuge operations. A list of ODFW/USFWS contacts will be coordinated through Wetlands and Wildlife LLC. This strategy will ensure high value habitat protection and no effect on water quality.

All temporary crossings of ditches, wet or dry, will span the ditch between the top of bank. Spanning crossings will allow complete avoidance of waterways and eliminate any need for removal and fill. Additionally, a 40-foot fire lane will separate the nearest camp vehicle on the south side of the ditch.

Based on the schedule of the venue, the layout of facilities and use of recommendations within this memo, it is my professional opinion that the proposed activities will not cause direct or indirect take of a federally listed species. Additionally, no element of the proposal indicates that adverse modification will occur to federally listed critical habitat.

*This conclusion is based on the ability of the organizers to enforce prohibitions on illegal entry into the refuge and continue to coordinate with the USFWS to help address any concerns.
