Marion County Parole and Probation is charged with monitoring and enforcing conditions set by the Court, the Board of Parole/ Post Supervision and /or Local Supervisory Authority when an offender is placed on Parole or Probation.

PROBATION

Supervised probation is a sentence imposed by the Court in which a convicted offender will be required to report to a Parole/Probation Officer. These officers will meet with the offender face to face at the office, the offenders home or place of employment. The PO supervises the offender to ensure the Courts conditions are followed and contact may decrease as offender's behavior permits.

PAROLE/POST PRISON SUPERVISION

An offender is placed on parole or post-prison supervision after they have served a prison sentence. When released from custody, they are considered to be on parole or post-prison supervision. The court no longer has jurisdiction, and the offender conditions are set by the Board of Parole or the local Supervisory Authority. These conditions will usually include a no contact with current and past victims.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

- Pay supervision fees, fines or other fees ordered by the court
- Not use or possess controlled substances except pursuant to a medical prescription
- Submit to testing of breath or urine for controlled substance or alcohol use if the probationer has illegally used controlled substance in the past.
- Participate in a substance abuse evaluation as directed by the supervision officer and follow the recommendations of the evaluator if there are reasonable grounds to believe there is a history of substance abuse
- Remain in the State of Oregon until written permission to leave is granted by the Department of Corrections or a county community corrections agency.
- If physically able, find and maintain gainful full-time employment, approved schooling, or a full-time combination of both. Any waiver of this requirement must be based on a finding by the Court stating the reasons for the waiver.
- Change neither employment or residence without prior permission from the Department of Corrections or a county community corrections agency
- Permit the supervising officer to visit the offender's residence or work site, and to conduct a walk-through of the common areas of the rooms in the residence occupied by or under the control of the offender. Report as required and abide by the direction of the supervising officer
- Consent to the search of person, vehicle or premises upon the request of a representative of the supervising officer if the supervising officer has reasonable grounds to believe a violation will be found, and submit to fingerprinting or photographing, or both, when requested by the Department of Corrections or a county community corrections agency for supervision
- Obey all laws
- Promptly and truthfully answer all reasonable inquiries by the Department of Corrections or county community corrections agency
- Not possess weapons, firearms, or dangerous animals
- If under supervision for, or previously convicted of, a sex offense and if recommended by the supervising officer, successfully complete a sex offender treatment program approved by the supervising officer and submit to polygraph at direction of supervising officer
- Participate in a mental health evaluation as directed by the supervising officer and follow the recommendations of the evaluator.

All offenders are subject to special conditions which are case specific
