INFORMATIONAL:

Discuss Replacing Third Party Administrator of C125 Benefit Cafeteria Plans

- Kathie Carter

Summary of presentation:

- The Benefits Department is replacing Professional Benefit Services:
 - They are currently the third party administrator that manages the county's Flexible Spending Accounts, COBRA, and retiree health plans;
 - There have been a lot of problems:
 - Jobs are not being done; and
 - Jobs are not being done accurately.
- Benefits would like the new administrator to also manage the Health Savings Accounts; and
- A broker put the job out for bid:
 - Four companies bid; and
 - Navia is the Benefits Department choice:
 - The lowest cost;
 - The longest price guarantee:
 - Five year guarantee on rates.
 - The county will save money and labor hours; and
 - Navia's mobile app and desk top site are very user friendly.

Board discussion:

- The transition will occur in January; and
- There will be employee education.

Paxis Good Behavior Game Program Update

- Kelly Martin, Susan McLauchlin, Katrina Rothenberger

Summary of presentation:

- The game helps students learn self-regulation skills, which helps them have better focus;
- Has been very helpful to teachers:
 - o Teachers report seeing the following in their classrooms:
 - More focus;
 - Less disruptive behaviors;
 - More helpful behaviors; and
 - Less stress.
- Students enjoy participating;
- All Paxis training is now virtual;
- Additional schools will be trained in September, October, and November of this year:
 - The goal is to train 300 additional staff members.
- Approximately 300 staff members have received training; and
- Seven school districts are participating.

Discuss Oregon Timber Counties Coalition

- Commissioner Cameron

Summary of presentation:

- Met with seven counties who have U.S. Forest Service property located within their boundaries;
- The coalition would replace the Association of Oregon Counties subcommittee that has not been very effective; and
- Participation would cost \$15,000:
 - Funds would go towards lobbying in Washington D.C. for U.S. Forest Service policies and procedures that would benefit timber.

Board discussion:

- Would work on getting policies that would keep timber receipts in local economies;
- The commissioners would like a work session on timber;
- The commissioners would like to participate in the coalition; and
- The cost could be less than \$15,000 depending on how many counties participate.

Ice Storm/Wildfires/COVID-19 Update

Summary of presentation:

Danielle Bethell:

- Concerned with the language Emergency Management is using in their messages to the public:
 - Inaccurate messages are being sent out due to the wrong terminology being used.
- Messages need to be coordinated with the Sheriff's Office; and
- There are issues with hazard tree clean up in the canyon:

- o There are properties that have not had trees removed; and
- There are homeowners who are unclear on the steps required to receive help.

Brandon Reich:

- Wildfire recovery building permits through August:
 - Over one third of homes have applied for permits;
 - Over one half of septics have applied for permits; and
 - Data includes commercial permits.
- Hiring the following temporary personnel to help with the work load:
 - Inspector;
 - o Plans examiner; and
 - Part-time plans examiner.

Tamra Goettsch:

- The Service Integration Team is in the process of hiring another Disaster Case Manager;
- Approximately 100 cases have not been assigned to a case manager; and
- Catholic Community Services case managers may be able to help with the backlog:
 - Would have to have approval from individuals for release of their information to Catholic Community Services.

Tom Rohlfing:

- Property tax refunds will be sent right away to properties that have been identified as having loss of value; and
- Refunds for properties that had disruption of use will require an application.

OTHER:

Jessica Stanton:

- Presented a draft of a proclamation acknowledging the one year anniversary of the wildfires; and
- The proclamation will be presented at tomorrow's board session.

Board discussion:

• The commissioners made a few edits to the proclamation.
