HEALTH

1. Consider approval of the Contract for Services with Mid-Willamette Valley Community Action Agency for \$109,676 to provide a peer support specialist to support mental health and veteran's court participants through June 30, 2019. —Cydney Nestor

Summary of presentation:

- Community Action Agency is the fiscal entity providing the funds for the programs;
- One full time FTE position to support mental health and veteran's court;
- Role in mental health court is to provide support to individuals participating in court and to sit on the treatment team to advocate for individual's needs;
- Role in veteran's court is similar to the role for mental health court, and additionally provides support and mentors the volunteers supporting the veterans.

Board discussion:

- It is a new position that has been filled, training has been provided and the work has begun;
- The position supports both courts; and
- The funding comes from the Criminal Justice Commission Grant for specialty courts;
- Community Action manages the funds; and
- Provides the money to the county to support the position.

MOTION: Commissioner Brentano moved for approval of the Contract for Services with Mid-Willamette Valley Community Action Agency for \$109,676 to provide a peer support specialist to support mental health and veteran's court participants through June 30, 2019. Seconded by Commissioner Cameron; motion carried. A voice vote was unanimous.

2. Consider approval of Amendment #2 to the Intergovernmental Agreement with Mid-Valley Behavioral Care Network for the county to receive \$210,502.73 in disbursement funds from the disbandment of the Mid-Willamette Acute Care Region to which the county provided funding. – Scott Richards, Ann-Marie Bandfield

Summary of presentation:

- Acute care refers to inpatient psychiatric hospitalizations;
- The state required that there be regional acute care entities;
- All counties received funds to pay for hospitalization costs for patients who were uninsured;
- Over the years, money was not all spent on hospitalization and was reinvested in diversion and respite services;
- Oregon Health Authority did not require acute care regions when Coordinated Care Organizations started;
- The decision was made to disband;
- The process started at the end of 2016;
- The county received one distribution of funds;
- This final distribution is the amount of savings from the funds that were not spent on acute care services;
- Received three distributions of surplus funds that were reinvested in crisis system and diversion;
- These funds may be used in a similar fashion;
- Currently receive funds directly from Oregon Health Authority through a contract to manage indigent hospitalization expenses;
- Funds used to maintain crisis respite services:
 - o Access to beds 24- hours a day;
 - o Crisis associates who can provide skills training and support during crisis;
 - o Monitor medications; and
 - o Provide transportation to emergency appointments.
- Prior funding through grants from acute care region has ceased and these funds will replace that; and
- Able to provide a robust system for county residents to get services instead of hospitalization.

Board discussion:

- The commissioners commented that the regional approach did not work as well as intended and the services provided on a county level will;
- The setup probably benefited smaller counties; and
- Through the Coordinated Care Network, Polk County still has access to all the services provided by Marion County and services for indigent care.

MOTION: Commissioner Cameron moved for approval Amendment #2 to the Intergovernmental Agreement with Mid-Valley Behavioral Care Network for the county to receive \$210,502.73 in disbursement funds from the disbandment of the Mid-Willamette Acute Care Region to which the county provided funding.

Seconded by Commissioner Brentano; motion carried. A voice vote was unanimous.
