
Marion County Dog Codes

b. solicit or collect donations.












MCDS has two Dog Control Officers

According to the American Veterinary Medical Foundation, there are approximately 75,000 dogs in Marion County!


Of those...only 22,000 are licensed.

Rabies in Oregon is on the rise!





Out of 14 cases reported in Marion County only one tested positive...but that is one too many!

Preventing Rabies

- ORS 433.365 Inoculation against rabies
- Safety AVMA states that rabies remains a major concern worldwide, killing more than 55,000 people every year
- Rabies inoculation of dogs reduces the risk of the virus spreading to humans

A Rabies Vaccination is required for all Marion County Dog Licenses.



Marion County Dog Control (MCDC) Officer Linsey Ober, MCDC witness and keeper appeared at the February 9, 2017 hearing. Under MCC 6.05.030, a keeper is a person who has responsibility for a dog.



Dog Control Officer Coverage

- Dog Control Officers cover all of Marion County except for the Woodburn city limits (they have their own community enforcement)
- Officer Karen Hilfiker South County
 Officer Linsey Ober North County
- Dog Control Officers are available
 Monday through Friday, 8 am to 5 pm
- Local law enforcement has access to the dog shelter after hours

Dog Licensing is Vital to Enforcement Efforts

- Helps keep the community safe rabies inoculation is required with each license.
- Returns lost dogs to their owners ASAP!
- About 55% of lost dogs are returned to their owners within the first week





Only 30% of dogs are estimated to be licensed in the county!

Shelter and Care

Priority #3

Medical and Technician Services

- Daily care and feeding
- In-house medical treatment is provided to all shelter dogs
- Specialty medical treatment, as needed
- Behavioral enrichment programs are available for most dogs



Dog Enrichment and Placement Services

- Volunteers provide important services to the dogs in our care
- Adoption 20% to 25% of dogs are released from the shelter
- Rescues & Fostering –15% of dogs
