Caption: Five-year local option levy for Emergency Service Operations

Question:

Shall District levy taxes of \$0.78 per \$1,000 of assessed value for five years beginning 2024-25 for emergency service operations? This measure may cause property taxes to increase more than three percent.

Summary: Polk County Fire District No. 1 has experienced a service demand increase of 40% over the past two years. In 2022, the District was not able to meet ambulance response standards due to insufficient staffing to meet the increased demand.

The current levy was approved by voters in 2014 and renewed at the same rate in 2019. The Board has attempted not to increase the levy despite increasing costs to provide services and an 85% increase in call volume over the past decade. This levy of \$0.78 of \$1,000 of taxable assessed value would allow the District to:

1: Hire additional Firefighter/EMT's to staff an additional ambulance or fire engine 24 hours a day in order to meet response standards

2: Fund short-term daytime firefighters during the summer wildland fire season when call volume and fire impacts increase

3: Fund the replacement of two ambulances that will reach the end of their service life during the 5-year

The levy would raise approximately \$1,349,423 in 2024-2025, \$1,389,906 in 2025-2026, \$1,431,603 in 2026-2027, \$1,474,551 in 2027-2028 and \$1,518,787 in 2028-2029 for a total of \$7,164,270. The estimated tax cost for this measure in an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the county assessor at the time of estimate and may reflect the impact of early payment discounts, compression, and the collection rate.
