### PUBLIC COMPETITIONS ENTRY INFORMATION

### **EXHIBITORS AND THEIR PROJECT**

- Public Competition projects will be accepted from exhibitors residing in Marion County, and counties located immediately adjacent to Marion County.
- 2. Every project must be entered in the name of the owner, maker, or grower.
- Each Public Competitions exhibitor, registering a project (or multiple projects) to exhibit at the fair, will receive one free entrance ticket to be used any day of the current fair.
- 4. Exhibitors may submit one entry per class, unless otherwise specified.
- 5. Entries incorrectly classified may be reclassified by the department superintendent and/or judge.
- 6. All entries, unless indicated as "Exhibit Only" will be reviewed by a qualified judge.
- 7. All projects must remain on display until 6 pm Sunday after which projects and awards will be released upon presentation of claim ticket(s). Items inadvertently left, post fair, must be claimed at the fair office within 2 weeks of the fair ending or items will be forfeited.
- 8. Ribbons, premium money (available for youth 17 and younger only), and other prizes will be distributed to winning exhibitors when projects are claimed on Sunday evening following fair. Any winnings inadvertently left post fair must be claimed at the fair office within 2 weeks of the fair ending or items will be forfeited.
- 9. Items previously exhibited at Marion County Fair are not eligible.
- Every exhibitor shall indemnify the Marion County Fair from, and against, all claims for damage to persons or property caused by his/her actions or by their projects.
- 11. Management will take reasonable precautions to insure safety to projects while on the grounds. However, Marion County Fair will not be responsible for loss or damage of any kind to projects.
- 12. Exhibitors found in violation of the rules, or in practices unethical or adverse to the Marion Country Fair, shall be penalized by forfeiture of awards and/or privileges.

### **GENERAL RULES**

- No person or group shall be allowed to sell or give away exhibits, or distribute information, without a permit agreement or consent of the fair board.
- 2. Any person willfully injuring or destroying any property on the fairgrounds, or in any way interfering with the administration, shall be liable to prosecution.
- 3. Persons having claims against the Marion County Fair Board shall present them within 10 days after the close of the fair.

#### REGISTRATION PROCESS

- Read and adhere to the specific rules listed at the beginning of each department class list.
- Pre-registration is strongly encouraged to help facilitate intake and judging of all contests. Please register on-line at marioncountyfair.net "Contests".
   (https://www.co.marion.or.us/CS/Fair)
   On-line registration closes midnight July 7, 2025. Each exhibitor will be given an exhibit confirmation number.

If you have any difficulties registering on-line, please contact the fair office at (503) 585-9998.

All registration should be done on-line with the exception of floral entries which can be registered on-site. If you are unable to register online, please come to the fair on the identified intake day for your project with the completed hard copy registration form, page 21 of this document.

- 3. INTAKE: Bring entries, along with your registration confirmation, to the fairgrounds on the identified intake day specific to the department. Entry tags with unique entry numbers will be provided for each item at the intake reception desk (pre-printed for all on-line registrants.) Tagged entries will be taken to the appropriate department for check-in.
- 4. PICKUP: Projects are to be picked up between 6-7 PM on Sunday following the close of fair. <u>Early pickup is not allowed.</u> If you are unable to do so, arrange for someone else to pick up your items using your claim ticket.

Important- Entries not picked up are subject to the fair's disposal!

### FAIR THEME- "Made in Marion"

### **ENTRY INTAKE**

Once the specific department exhibit entry times have been established, the information will be posted on the fair's website at https://marioncountyfair.net/contests.

### **JUDGING**

- Each superintendent, under the direction of the fair board, shall have full charge of his/her department.
   The superintendent may reclassify entries wrongly classified. No entries will be reclassified after judging.
   The superintendent, at his/her discretion, may exclude any entry deemed inappropriate.
- 2. Fair management and superintendents will do their best to secure qualified judges. Entries will be judged according to guidelines specific to each department.
- A judge shall disqualify, or transfer to the correct class, any project which is not a true representative of the class in which it is entered.
- 4. Persons interfering with Marion County Fair staff, or with judges during judging, will be removed immediately from the judging and from competition. They will be subject to additional penalties as deemed appropriate by fair management.
- No person shall act as a judge in any division in which he/she, or an immediate family member, is an exhibitor.
- 6. It is understood that the act of entering a project or contest at the Marion County Fair is asking fair management to secure a qualified judge to place a judgment on the project or performance. It is therefore courteous to gracefully accept the decision of the judge, realizing that it may be in conflict with your set of standards. If you feel you are not willing to accept this judgment, please write "Exhibit Only" on your entry.
- Judging criteria- classes may not necessarily receive a 1st, 2nd, or 3rd place; placement is the judge's decision. Please refer to ribbon criteria for more information.

8. The decision of the judge is final; direct any concerns you may have regarding a decision to the department's superintendent.

### **RIBBON CRITERIA**

**Best of Show**- Awarded to a single most exceptional piece in each department (or sub-department where applicable.)

**Best of Division**- Awarded to an exhibit in a division with more than 3 classes and which contain blue ribbons.

1st, 2nd, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place ribbons may, or may not, be awarded in each class; judges may use discretion to not award a ribbon where it is not warranted.

**Superintendent's Choice-** One entry chosen at the discretion of the department's superintendent; up to 1 adult and 1 youth given per department.

**Judges' Choice-** One entry chosen at the discretion of the department's judge or group of judges; up to 1 adult and 1 youth given per department.

**People's Choice**- Holding a People's Choice contest by public vote will be up to the superintendent's discretion. The entry with the most votes from the public will be awarded on Sunday afternoon; 1 adult and 1 youth given per participating department.

### **DEPARTMENT- Creative Arts**

- 1. Entries must be the original two-dimensional work of the artist; no copies of other artists or photographers. Digital Art classes must be the work of the artist and should not be created using AI (Artificial Intelligence.) School projects are acceptable in youth divisions.
- 2. Entries must be completely dry, framed, wired, and ready for hanging.
- 3. Each exhibit must be matted and mounted. Hanging devices with a supporting wire is required. Photos printed on canvas and mounted on wooden stretchers are acceptable; prints on metal with a hanging wire are also acceptable. To ensure wire is secure, test by hanging photo at home for at least 24 hrs. prior to fair.
- 4. Frames containing glass are acceptable; however the Marion County Fair cannot be responsible for breakage. Plexiglas or plastic is also acceptable.
- 5. Work must have been completed in the last two years and never before entered in the Marion County Fair.
- 6. Each entry must have the TITLE, NAME, AND ADDRESS OF EXHIBITOR, WRITTEN CLEARLY AND LEGIBLY, ON THE REVERSE SIDE OF THE MOUNT. Exhibitor's name must NOT be visible on front of entry.
- 7. "Professionals" refers to teachers, judges, instructors, advisors, owner/operator, and demonstrators engaged in business relating to their

- Superintendents/judges reserve the right to disqualify any entry at their discretion.

## DEPARTMENT- Floral & Garden

- All containers and accessories should be labeled with owner's name and phone number.
- Additional requirements for specific classes also apply; see requirements per class.
- A "spray" means 1 branch or shoot.
- Exhibitor must grow all entries 60 days before entering with the exception of Division 204 Professional Arrangements.
- "Professionals" refers to teachers, judges, instructors, advisors, owner/operator, and demonstrators engaged in business relating to their area of exhibits or to those who sell their items for more than cost.
- Exhibitors can use containers provided by Marion County Fair; if using your own, you will be responsible for any damage or loss.

### **Helpful Hints:**

- Place flowers in warm water immediately after cutting.
   After 20 minutes, transfer stems to cold water.
- Flowers with milky sap (dahlias, poppies, etc.) may have cut ends sealed by burning with a flame.
- Cut as long a stem as possible.
   At fair, shorten (if required) to specified length.
- Clean leaves. Remove bugs, damaged leaves, and blemishes. if these items are found, it may reduce the judge's score.

- 2. Foods may, or may not, be tasted; it is up to the judge's discretion.

### PRESERVED FOODS

- All preserved foods should be in a standard jar designed for canning purposes.
- Lids must be screw tops.
- Exhibits must be accurately labeled as to content, processing method, time processed, and date of processing.
- All dried foods must be accurately labeled as to content, pretreatment drying method, and date of processing.
- All preserved products must be processed according to canning methods recommended by the

- current Oregon State University Extension Bulletin. (This is available at the Marion County Extension Office, 1320 Capitol Street, Salem, OR 503-588-5301.)
- All entries must have been completed by the exhibitor within one year of the opening date of the current year's fair.

### Canning:

- A weighted gauge is 10 lbs. of pressure compared to 11 lbs. of pressure on a dial gauge.
- Time and pressure corrections for processing at higher altitudes have been revised for both pressure and boiling water canning.
- Tomato canning- home canners may choose among 4 styles of crushed or whole/halved packs. Both pressure canner and boiling water processing times are provided for all packs. "Crushed" and "whole halved packed in water" may give the best quality products.
- Canning of smoked fish is not recommended.
- Paraffin is not recommended.
   Process jams and jellies for at least 5 minutes in a boiling water canner.

- All recipes become the property of Marion County Dairy Women.
- 2. Only one cheesecake entry allowed per contestant.
- Must bring in entire cheesecake, no individual servings; 8" or 9" cheesecakes are acceptable.
- The recipe must be made from scratch and must contain two (or more) dairy products from cow's milk. (Eggs are not considered a dairy product.)
- 5. Please submit the recipe (typed or neatly printed) on an 8½ x 11 sheet of paper with name, address, and phone number on the back of the recipe.

Dairy Women monetary awards will be dispersed out of the fair office Sunday.

## Dairy Women Cheesecake Award Amounts:

The term "Professional" refers to an individual who makes the majority of his or her income from the selling of their photographic work. If you have questions about whether you do, or do not, qualify as a professional, please ask to speak with the department's superintendent for clarification.
- All photographs must be the original work of the exhibitor and may not have been submitted previously to the Marion County Fair.
- All camera-created (from 3. homemade pinhole cameras to professional (D)SLRs/mirrorless models) are acceptable; this includes film, digital, and cellphone prints. Please see the category "The Unusual View" for aggressively altered images, including those using "artificial intelligence" (AI) software tools in post processing. The Marion County Fair's stance on the use of such tools will adhere to those of the North American Nature Photography Association (https://nanpa.org/2025showcase/showcase-ai-rules/). All entries to the photo exhibit must be the result of direct human effort and creativity.
- 4. Photographs must be printed on photo paper and need to be mounted on mat board or foam core with a ¼ inch maximum thickness. No frames/glass covered entries are allowed due to the weight inherent in their use. The minimum size of the print is 8"x10." The maximum size

- of the print is 16"x20." There will not be a requirement to provide string, wire, or other hanging devices with the exhibit. (They can be provided but are not required.)
- 5. Each exhibit must have the items listed below clearly written on the reverse side of the exhibit on the entry tag and also on the official entry form.
  - The title of the exhibit.
  - The name of the exhibitor.
  - The division and class number Neither the exhibitor's name, nor any identifying logo, can be visible on the front of the exhibit.
- 6. The superintendent has the final authority to accept or reject an entry for any reason. However, this event provides an opportunity for each photographer to show their best work and to experiment with new techniques and ideas.

### **JUDGING TIPS**

- Every graphic artist has the same goal- to reveal to viewers something they would have not otherwise noticed. Show the judges why your exhibit is special through color, composition, focus, and tonal range.
- Winning exhibits stand out from the rest in terms of subject matter, composition and lighting.
- •As long as the image of your exhibit remains crisp, a larger print will have an advantage over a smaller one. (Please see item number 4 above for size requirements.)
- •Exhibits may be printed as glossy or matte, but keep in mind glossy retain more detail.
- Software post-processing, and film enlarging processing, is acceptable for photographic entries. Exhibits that were processed with extensive use of "AI" tools must be entered into the "Unusual View" category. This category is often described with the phrase "Altered Reality" in other contests. Please see item number 3 for additional information on this topic.

### **TERMS**

- The Unusual View: images aggressively altered by software, or other methods. This includes the use of "AI" software tools such as "generative fill."
- Cyanotypes: photos in monochrome blue.
- Events: any unposed gathering of people- sports, street photography, parades, circuses, etc.
- Macro: extremely close-up photos of subjects. (Strictly speaking, images with a '1 to 1' size ratio between actual subject and 'size of subject' on the film or digital sensor.)
- Monochrome: includes B&W, Selective Coloration, Sepia, or any tinted monochrome technique or historic technique such as daguerreotypes, cyanotypes, etc.
- Panorama: a photograph stitched together from several photographs to create a single image with a greater width or height than is generally possible from a single photo. However, some panoramic images may be from a single photograph taken.
- Portraits: posed images of people (or pets) that reveal something about their character.
- Selective Coloration: the process which converts most of an image to black and white but leaves a single color in a select area for emphasis. For example, a street scene which is entirely black and white except for a red stop sign.
- Film Specific- photographs taken with film (rather than digital sensors) with a possible goal of highlighting the character of certain film stocks. Feel free to note the name of the film stock used with the photographer's identifying information (entry tag).
- Still Life- An image showing nonmoving objects such as flowers, bowls, pitchers, etc.
