POSITION OVERVIEW AND NOTES: GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES

In the Deputy District Attorney series, this is the entry level classification. Under supervision, conducts limited delinquency adjudications in Circuit Court proceedings on behalf of Marion County. Performs other work as required.

SUPERVISION RECEIVED

Works under the supervision of a Trial Team Supervisor, who assigns work, reviews performance, and advises on unusual or difficult problems. This is an unclassified position that serves at the pleasure of the appointing authority.

SUPERVISION EXERCISED

Supervision of employees is not a responsibility of positions in this class.

TYPICAL DUTIES - DUTIES INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. Reviews, files and prosecutes felonies, misdemeanors, major traffic offenses, and some violation of restraining order matters in Marion County's Juvenile Court; reviews police reports, and make initial charging decisions; prepares for trial including contacting witnesses and reviewing the case; prepares and argues pretrial motions; performs legal research; presents case to court; represents State at sentencing; appears in Circuit Court.
- 2. Reviews and prosecutes probation violations arising out of delinquency adjudications.
- 3. Works collaboratively with the Marion County Juvenile Department to identify best outcomes for youth.
- 4. Represents State in de novo appeals from justice court. Represents State in postconviction relief hearings involving delinguency adjudications.
- 5. Assists police agencies in the application for pick up orders and search warrants.
- 6. Provides law enforcement officials with legal advice in selected areas, which increases in scope and complexity commensurate with experience.
- 7. Work with Juvenile Department on problem-solving issues regarding youth safety, such as runaway pick-up orders, interstate transfers, and identifying creative solutions to connect Youth to appropriate services.

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE POSITION: EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING:

- Graduation from an accredited school of law; AND
- Successfully passed the Oregon State Bar Exam; AND
- Must be a member in good standing of the Oregon State Bar; AND
- Participation in internship/clerkship with a law firm (preferably a District Attorney's Office) involved in litigation of criminal cases; or
- Internship/clerkship with a Judge (trial or appellate) with the assigned responsibility for deciding issues arising in criminal cases.

NECESSARY SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Must pass a criminal history background investigation, which includes fingerprinting;
- Must possess a current driver's license in the applicant's state of residence and an
 acceptable driving history. Marion County will obtain a copy of the driving record for all
 qualified applicants from Driver and Motor Vehicle Services.
- This is a safety sensitive/special needs position. Final candidates selected for this
 position will be required to pass a pre-employment drug screen, including testing for

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITY:

Good knowledge of criminal law and the practices and procedures of criminal prosecution. Good knowledge of trial and courtroom procedures. Ability to analyze facts, evidence and precedents and to arrive at logical conclusions. Ability to appear effectively before a trial court or administrative body. Superior communication skills. Ability to maintain effective working relationships with numerous community partners, including courts, public, police, Marion County Juvenile Department and other agencies; ability to effectively work as a team member. Ability to work effectively and thoroughly with little oversight.
