The following are abbreviated statesments of county Strategic Plan goals linked to county programs supporting those goals.

Operational Efficiency and Quality Service is encompassed in general government and central service departments' programs, as well as General Fund non-departmental programs. In the general government area, the budget for the Assessor's Office is $\$ 5.8$ million and 51.0 FTE to continue property appraisal and tax assessment. The Clerk's Office budget is $\$ 2.6$ million and 14.0 FTE for recording, licensing, elections, Board of Property Tax Appeals, and archives services; this is a decrease of $\$ 0.2$ million and 0.5 FTE as the upcoming fiscal year will not be a major election year. The Treasurer's Office budget is $\$ 0.5$ million and 3.0 FTE to continue its treasury services. Other budgeted General Fund costs totaling $\$ 15.7$ million include transfers to other county government activities, contributions to outside agencies such as the state's water master and predatory animal programs, funds to continue audits of county programs, and for the Marion County Business Enterprise Enhancement (McBEE) project to upgrade the county computerized financial management system. Other General Fund costs will decrease by $\$ 1.1$ million primarily from a decrease of $\$ 0.4$ million for the McBEE project and a $\$ 0.5$ million decease in combined contingency and ending fund balance.
In the central services area, the Board of Commissioners' budget is $\$ 2.1$ million and 14.0 FTE. The Business Services budget is $\$ 6.3$ million and 57.5 FTE which is a decrease of $\$ 0.1$ million. The Finance budget is $\$ 2.4$ million and 19.0 FTE. The Information Technology budget is $\$ 8.4$ million and 53.0 FTE. The Legal Counsel budget totals $\$ 1.9$ million and 10.8 FTE including the Law Library. Overall, the Central Services Fund budget will decrease by $\$ 0.7$ million and 2.0 FTE.

The Growth and Infrastructure budget consists of the $\$ 34.5$ million Environmental Services program which includes solid waste management and recycling, the $\$ 0.4$ million County Parks program, the $\$ 1.0$ million Land Use Planning program, and the $\$ 2.3$ million Building Inspection program, all managed by the Public Works Department. All four budgets in this category have decreases which in aggregate total $\$ 4.0$ million or $-9.5 \%$.

Public Safety is one of the county's highest priorities and it is allocated $76 \%$ of General Fund operating expenditures or $22 \%$ of total county resources. The Sheriff's Office budget of $\$ 54.5$ million and 339.3 FTE includes enforcement, the county jail, parole and probation, and code enforcement. The District Attomey's budget is $\$ 9.8$ million to fund criminal prosecution, victims of crime assistance, and child support enforcement, employing 83.2 FTE. The Juvenile budget of $\$ 12.5$ million and 103.4 FTE provides detention and juvenile alternative programs, case management and counseling. Two Justice Courts have a combined $\$ 0.9$ million budget and 9.0 FTE to hear traffic offenses, some misdemeanors, and small civil claims. There is virtually no change to the total Public Safety budget or to the individual department budgets.

The Economic Development budget of $\$ 3.2$ million promotes economic development through the county's Economic Development Advisory Board and allocation of the county's $\$ 2.8$ million in state lottery funds to support economic development. Another economic development activity is the Marion County Fair, with a budget at $\$ 0.4$ million and 0.5 FTE . The increase in requirements is due to a combined increase in carryover and $16 \%$ in new state lottery funding.

The Transportation budget includes roads and bridges maintenance and repair, ferry operations, fleet management, and county surveyor. They are managed by the Public Works Department and consist of $\$ 55.4$ million and 129.2 FTE. The Transportation budget increased by $\$ 6.3$ million primarily from federal grants for road improvements (up $\$ 5.3 \mathrm{M}$ ) and state gas tax (up $\$ 0.9 \mathrm{M}$ ). Major road work include $\$ 1.7$ million for Wipper Road timber bridge replacement, $\$ 1.8$ million for Ward Drive urban improvements, $\$ 1.6$ million for Auburn Road transportation enhancements, and $\$ 0.9$ million for Meridan Road intersection reconfiguration. The Emergency Management budget is $\$ 0.7$ million and 3.25 FTE. The program manages natural disasters such as floods, landslides, high winds, severe winter storms, and earthquakes through an Emergency Operations Center and coordinates emergency planning and drills with local, state and federal partners.

The Health Department budget totals $\$ 64.5$ million and 347.9 FTE. Services include developmental disabilities, both children and adult behavioral health, community and provider services, drug treatment, acute psychiatric and mental health diversion, public health, WIC (women, infant and children), environmental health, and vital statistics. The department budget decreased $\$ 1.0$ million in contingency and ending fund balance. There is also a Health Integrated Delivery System $\$ 2.0$ million reserve. The Community Services Department budget totals $\$ 3.0$ million and 14.1 FTE. The department operates Dog Control, Oregon State Extension Services, and County Fair programs (the latter is discussed under Economic Development). The department budget declined $\$ 1.9$ million and 3.7 FTE as state funding for Children and Families activities was significantly reduced as funding begins to be phased-out as a new state service delivery model is instituted.

The Capital budget accounts for the acquisition, construction or remediation of major capital facilities, equipment or other fixed assets, excluding Public Works Department roads and bridges, and a Health building reserve ( $\$ 0.8$ million). Amounts budgeted vary widely from year-to-year. Major projects funded for FY 201314 include $\$ 13.9$ million for remediation of Courthouse Square, $\$ 4.1$ million for HVAC system upgrades at three facilities, $\$ 1.2$ million for jail roof repair, $\$ 6.3$ million for Courthouse parking expansion, $\$ 0.6$ million Health Building window replacement, and $\$ 1.4$ million for assessor assessment and taxation software.

Non-Operating activities are not assigned to specific department budgets. Budgeted expenditures include $\$ 33.1$ million (a $\$ 0.8$ million decrease) for the Self-Insurance program which pays the cost of county insurance programs, $\$ 4.3$ million for PERS Debt Service, $\$ 2.4$ million for Courthouse Square Redevelopment (a $\$ 0.3$ million decrease), $\$ 2.2$ million for a Rainy Day Reserve, $\$ 1.5$ million for Courthouse Square Debt Service, $\$ 0.6$ million for Non-Departmental Grants ( $\$ 0.5$ million decrease), $\$ 0.4$ million for Tax Title Land Sales, and $\$ 0.3$ million for County Schools (a $\$ 0.4$ million decrease).
