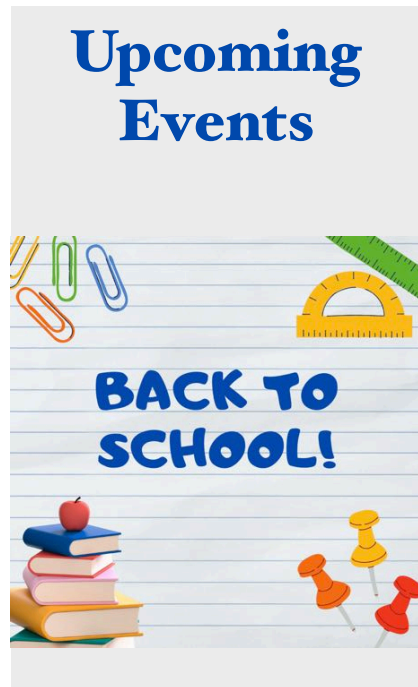

In your yearly housing inspection, proper egresses are a critical focus to ensure safety. Inspection personnel will check that all exits, including all exterior doors and windows, are easily operable, and that bedrooms have direct exit routes and operable windows. They will also ensure that stairways and hallways are clear, smoke alarms are functioning, and egress routes are accessible for individuals with disabilities. These measures are essential for creating a safe living environment.
