<u>Call to Order</u>: Chair Ray Wilson called the meeting to order at 8:05 a.m.

Announcements:

 - o Sue is moving to Wyoming

Approval of Meeting Minutes:

Guest Speaker:

- ➤ DA Walt Beglau-Opiate/Heroin Problem
 - This is a national phenomenon, not one that only Marion County is dealing with.
 - o Deaths from Heroin use are up 20%
 - o Infants are being born addicted to painkillers
 - Painkillers are a gateway to Heroin use. People that are addicted to painkillers and are unable to get more will turn to Heroin because it is cheap and easily accessible.
 - o There is a large concern about the strong re-emergence of opiate based addictions.

- o There have been 5 opiate deaths in Marion County since April 16, 2012 that is more deaths then the whole year of 2011.
- o Delivery of Heroin is up 60%
- o Possession is up 30%
- The addiction of Opiates is impacting the treatment community
 - Bridgeway is seeing more people coming in around opiate and prescribing addictions
 - With the pharmacy lockout program the need for treatment will increase
 - 70% of methadone clients are from prescription addictions in the last few years
 - Methadone is long term and costly
- O We need to look at this addiction from a public health perspective and not as a law enforcement issue (this is a new version of an old problem)
 - Addiction is the issue and not a heroin issue. It looks and feels different than what was faced with meth a few years ago.
 - Need to attach both heroin and prescription drugs at the same time
 - The Pain clinic is trying to engage people around how to manage life long conditions without medication.
 - There needs to me more education within the treatment community about what good pain management looks like
 - Adult drug court cases are about ½ opiate addiction related
 - Drug court is starting to see adolescents with opiate based addictions
- Senator Winters has convened a group of people to start a discussion around the issues. They are extending the conversation to the children's and families commission
 - The areas they are looking at are community education and public awareness
 - Need to partner with schools around an awareness campaign
 - Work with the Hospitals around prescribing drugs
- o There is no quick solution to this problem
- Drug trafficking through Mexico is a big issue tar heroin is becoming the largest problem
- We need to use existing resources to build a community plan
- o What can LADPC do:
 - Be more politically active and put some pressure on legislation
 - Help find funding for treatment so there isn't an revolving door
 - Get the word out in the community with forums or informational meetings and put faces on the problem
 - Talk about Prevention and treatment together
 - Kids think differently than adults

- Sub Committee to explore issues with some recommendation on what we can do
 - Gary, Wendy and someone from prevention
- The message of prevention is effective and treatment work

Problem Gambling Presentation:

 - o Student wellness survey showed the correlation between gambling and drug and alcohol use
 - o Gambling is going up most are betting on personal skill, sports events, cards or dice rolling
 - o Gambling and suicide/depression show correlations
 - Youth parent outreach
 - Addiction Sculpt is a presentation that is done for middle school aged kids
 - o Teens and Drug Family workshop
 - o Problem gambling art contest
 - o Business outreach
 - o Employee stuffers
 - o Community Outreach
 - o "Gambling Boys" video over 60 people came

 - o WVCH LLC just got approved yesterday by OHA as a CCO

 - o Need to have a presentation on Legality
 - o Added a section on Senior gambling

Street Drugs

- ➤ Jon went to a seminar in Utah about the current status of street drugs

 - Bath salts

 - Newest drug on scene is called crocodile. It is a big problem in Russia right now. It is a combination of codeine and hydrochloric acid. It is injected and creates leathery skin and eats through tissue to expose bone. There are examples on utube.
