

The Region X Interagency COVID-19 Economic Recovery Taskforce stood up in early April 2020 to provide a unifying structure for federal, state, and tribal agencies supporting economic stabilization in the four Northwest States of Alaska, Idaho, Oregon, and Washington.

The Task Force consists of multiple agencies and is focused on three major lines of effort:

- To regionalize federal capability to support state, tribe, and local economic recovery interests
- To provide situational awareness of economic trends and advise decision makers
- To communicate and coordinate federal CAREs Act recovery funding and programs to stakeholders

Small Business Administration Economic Injury Disaster Loans & Advance Program: SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loans and Advance Program has reopened its portal to all eligible small businesses and nonprofits impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The reopened portal can be found <u>here.</u>

On July, 9, 2020, U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue announced an initial list of additional commodities that have been added to the Coronavirus Food Assistance Program (CFAP), and other adjustments USDA has made to the program based on comments received from agricultural producers and organizations and review of market data.

Producers will be able to submit applications that include these commodities on **Monday**, **July 13**, **2020**. USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) is accepting applications for CFAP through Aug. 28, 2020. USDA expects additional eligible commodities to be announced in the coming weeks.

On July 2, 2020, the Department of the Treasury's Office of Inspector General (OIG) released reporting requirements for CRF recipients in a <u>memorandum</u> that provides record keeping and reporting instructions. <u>First quarterly</u> report is due on July 17, 2020. LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

Research for Equity in Recovery: Place-Based Strategies

The second event in the Research for Equity in Recovery series will take place on Thursday, July 16, at 12 pm ET, and will focus on how recovery efforts can prevent the COVID-19 pandemic from widening the divide between prosperous coastal cities and distressed metropolitan regions with little high-tech growth.
