



Imminent Health Hazards

An **Imminent Health Hazard** is a serious threat to health. It occurs when there is clear evidence that a product, practice, situation, or event could cause harm. This means action must be taken immediately to fix the problem or stop operations to prevent injuries. If you suspect that any of the below conditions are present, please call the number below and report your concerns. Thank you!

Attention: The following conditions may require immediate closure of this Aquatic Facility:

Safety issues:

- Broken, unsecured, or missing drain covers
- Electrical hazards (bare wires, unprotected overhead wires or non-GFCI receptacles within 20 feet)
- Missing **all** lifesaving equipment on deck (reaching pole and life ring)
- Missing or incorrect depth markings
- Enclosure fence, wall, gate, door in disrepair
- Overcrowding (number of bathers exceeds capacity; _____ maximum)
- Broken glass within enclosure
- Lightning or severe storms within 10 miles

Water quality issues:

- Disinfectant residual concentrations below minimum or above levels
- Chlorine stabilizers ratio exceeding the limit
- Contaminated water supply or unapproved water source
- pH levels below 7.0 or above 7.8
- Pool floor not visible (cloudy water)
- Filtration or disinfection equipment not in operation
- Improper cross-connections in plumbing

Contamination in the Water:

- Feces or vomit in the water
