

# Recovery At A Glance– Marion County Jan. 26, 2021

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(As of Jan. 25, 2020, unless otherwise noted)

- Applicants should stay in touch with FEMA to keep their recovery on track. Missing or incorrect information could result in delays in receiving assistance.
- Survivors can stay in touch the following ways: Visit [DisasterAssistance.gov](https://www.disasterassistance.gov); download the [FEMA app](#); or call the FEMA Helpline at **800-621-3362** (TTY: 800-462-7585). Multilingual operators are available 7 a.m. to 10 p.m., seven days a week.
- 338 individuals and households have been approved for nearly \$1.9 million in federal grants through FEMA's Individuals and Households Program.
- More than \$9.7 million in U.S. Small Business Administration low-interest disaster loans have been approved for 77 homeowners and renters and four businesses as of Jan. 15.

## Housing Assistance:

- Nearly \$1.3 million in grants approved for housing repairs or replacement for 224 homeowners.
- \$598,883 in grants have been approved for personal property, transportation and other disaster-related serious needs for 278 applicants.
- 698 home inspections have been issued with 99 percent completed.

## Direct Temporary Housing

- Marion is one of five Oregon counties approved to participate in FEMA's Direct Temporary Housing Program.
- Construction on a new Mill City site began earlier this month, with work completed ahead of schedule. The site is currently scheduled to house 13 manufactured housing units (MHUs) and can accommodate up to 16 MHUs, providing necessary temporary housing for the qualified residents of both Linn and Marion counties.
- Temporary housing is provided one of two ways: recreational vehicles (RVs) and Manufactured Housing Units (mobile homes).
- Survivor housing units are chosen by FEMA based on the survivor family composition and needs, as well as to ensure that requirements for access or functional needs are met.
- Ongoing participation in the program, which can last until March 2022, depends on each survivor's efforts to find a permanent housing solution and following the rules established by the park and FEMA.
