NOTICE OF DECISION ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW CASE NO. 19-017

<u>APPLICATION</u>: Application of Petr Anfilofieff for an administrative review to place a primary farm dwelling on a 9.52 acre parcel in an EFU (Exclusive Farm Use) zone located in the 2200 block of Molalla Rd. NE, Woodburn. (T5S; R1W; Section 9B; tax lot 500).

<u>DECISION</u>: The Planning Director for Marion County has **APPROVED** the above-described Administrative Review, subject to certain conditions.

EXPIRATION DATE: This decision is valid only when exercised by **September 19, 2023** unless an extension is granted. The effective period may be extended one time, for two years, subject to approval of an extension. Request for an extension must be submitted to the Planning Division prior to expiration of the approval (form available from the Planning Division).

<u>WARNING:</u> A decision approving the proposal is for land use purposes only. Due to septic, well, and drainfield replacement areas, this parcel may not be able to support the proposal. To be sure the subject property can accommodate the proposed use the applicant should contact the Building Inspection Division, (503) 588-5147.

This decision does not include approval of a building permit.

<u>CONDITIONS</u>: The following conditions must be met <u>before a building permit can be obtained or the approved use</u> established:

- 1. The applicants shall obtain all permits, including subsurface sewage disposal, required by the Marion County Building Inspection Division.
- 2. Prior to issuance of any building permit for a new dwelling, the applicants shall sign and submit a Declaratory/Farm-Forest Statement (enclosed) to the Planning Division. This Statement shall be recorded by the applicant with the Marion County Clerk after it has been reviewed and signed by the Planning Director.
- 3. Prior to the final occupancy the applicant must provide evidence, to the satisfaction of the Planning Director, that the dwelling is, or will be, occupied by the owner or an employee of the current farm operation.
- 4. Prior to issuance of any building permit for a new dwelling, the applicant shall provide evidence to the Planning Director that the access conditions provided by the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) have been satisfied.

OTHER PERMITS, FEES AND RESTRICTIONS: This approval does not remove or affect any covenants or restrictions imposed on the subject property by deed or other instrument. The proposed use may require permits and/or fees from other local, state or federal agencies. This decision does not take the place of, or relieve the responsibility for, obtaining other permits or satisfying any restrictions or conditions thereon. It is recommended that the agencies mentioned in Finding #6 be contacted to identify restrictions or necessary permits. The applicant is advised of the following:

- 5. The applicants should contact the Woodburn Fire District to obtain a copy of the District's Recommended Building Access and Premise Identification regulations and the Marion County Fire Code Applications Guide. Fire District access standards may be more restrictive than County standards.
- 6. The applicants should contact Marion County Land Development and Engineering (503-584-7714) for additional Engineering Requirements and Advisories, listed in Finding #6 below, that may be required.

APPEAL PROCEDURE: The Marion County Zone Code provides that certain applications be considered first by the County Planning Director. If there is any doubt that the application conforms with adopted land use policies and regulations, the Director must deny the application. Anyone who disagrees with the Director's decision may appeal the decision to a Marion County hearings officer. The applicant may also request reconsideration (one time only and a \$200.00 fee) on the basis of new information subject to signing an extension of the 150 day time limit for review of zoning applications. A public hearing is held on appeals subject to the appellant paying a \$250.00 fee. Appeals must be in writing (form available from the Planning Division) and received in the Marion County Planning Division, 5155 Silverton Rd. NE, Salem by 5:00 p.m. on September 19, 2019. If you have questions about this decision contact the Planning Division at (503) 588-5038 or visit the office. This decision is effective on September 20, 2019 unless appealed.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS: Findings and conclusions on which the decision was based are noted below.

- 1. The subject property is designated Primary Agriculture in the Marion County Comprehensive Plan and zoned EFU (Exclusive Farm Use). The intent of both designation and zone is to promote and protect commercial agricultural operations. Dwellings in conjunction with farming may be approved subject to certain criteria.
- 2. The subject property is located on the north side of Molalla Road. The property is currently undeveloped, but contains berries for agricultural production. The property was described by deed on December 17, 1975 (Reel 34, Page 378) and is, therefore, considered a legal parcel for land use purposes.
- 3. Surrounding properties to the west, south and east are zoned EFU and devoted to various types of farm use. The property to the north is zoned P (Public) and developed for public use.
- 4. The applicants are proposing to place a primary farm dwelling on the southern portion of the property.
- 5. <u>Soil Survey of Marion County Oregon</u> indicates 100% of the subject property is high-value farm soils.
- 6. <u>Public Works Land Development and Engineering Permits</u> (LDEP) requested that the following Requirements be included in the land use decision:
 - A. "Molalla Road, a.k.a. SR 211, is under ODOT jurisdiction. Prior to issuance of building permits, the Applicant is required to provide evidence to MCPW Engineering, either directly or indirectly, of an ODOT Approach Permit or waiver.
 - B. The subject property is within the unincorporated area of Marion County and will be assessed Transportation & Parks System Development Charges (SDCs) upon application for building permits, per Marion County Ordinances #00-10R and #98-40R, respectively."

LDEP also requested that the following Advisory be included in the decision:

C. "Being ODOT is the Road Authority, any ground disturbing utility work in Molalla Road public right-of-way would need to be coordinated through ODOT."

Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) requested that the following comments be included in the land use decision: "The property has frontage on the Woodburn – Estacada Highway No. 161 (OR-211). The property appears to be served by a highway approach at MP 0.58, which is on or near the eastern property line (shared with TL400). It is unclear from the site plan if the applicant will continue to use the shared approach (Option 1, below) or if they are proposing to construct a new approach where the gravel road extends from the house at MP 0.52 (Option 2, below).

- If the applicant plans to continue to use the shared approach at MP 0.58, then <u>ODOT has no objections to the proposal</u> and the approach can continue to be used as is.
- If the applicant plans to construct a new approach at MP 0.52 at the end of the gravel road, then the applicant will need to submit an Application for State Highway Approach. The applicant can contact me to begin the process."

<u>Marion County Building Inspection</u> commented that a building permit is required for new construction or placement of a manufactured home.

Marion County Building Inspection Onsite Wastewater Specialist commented that site evaluation is required.

All other contacted agencies stated no objections to the proposal.

- 7. Primary farm dwellings located on high-value farmland may be approved when the standards in Chapter 17.136.030(A)(1) of the Marion County Code (MCC) are satisfied. These standards include:
 - A. There is no dwelling on the subject farm operation on lands zoned EFU, SA or FT other than seasonal farm worker housing. The term "farm operation" means all lots or parcels of land in the same ownership that are used by the farm operator for farm use;
 - B. The farm operator earned on the subject tract in the last two years, three of the last five years, or the average of the best three of the last five years at least \$80,000 in gross annual income from the sale of farm products. In determining gross annual income from the sale of farm products, the cost of purchased livestock shall be deducted from the total gross income attributed to the tract. Only gross income from land owned, not leased or rented, shall be counted;
 - C. The subject tract is currently employed for the farm use that produced the income required in subsection (A)(1)(b) of this section;
 - D. The proposed dwelling will be occupied by a person or persons who produced the commodities which generated the income in subsection (A)(1)(b) of this section.
- 8. This is the only property owned by Petr Anfilofieff that produced the farm income required in criterion #7(b). There is no existing dwelling on the subject property. The criterion in #7(a) is met. The applicant provided evidence that in 2017 and 2018 the subject property produced farm income valued at more than \$80,000 in each of those years. The criterion in #7(b) is met. The property is currently in use for growing berries. As the principal farm operator, the applicant intends to live in the dwelling once it is complete. The criterion in #7(c) and (d) are met.
- 9. Although the primary farm dwelling is approved, the applicants will be required to sign and record a Farm/Forest Declaratory Statement prior to placing a new dwelling on the property as a condition of approval. This acknowledges the impacts of farm and forest management practices conducted in the area.
- 10. Based on the above findings, it has been determined that the property meets the criteria for establishing a farm dwelling and the request, therefore, is **APPROVED**, subject to certain conditions.
